Propane Updates

As we wrap up this winter, we want to remind our propane customers that if you have remaining gallons on your contract, you have until April 25 to schedule your final delivery. If your tank is at 45% or less, please give us a call so we can ensure your tank is topped off. Any unused gallons will be credited to your standard account at the end of April. New contract prices and budget pricing will be available in mid-July.

To help manage your propane expenses, we offer a budget plan that allows you to make monthly payments. This way, you can avoid large bills during the holiday season and ensure a steady supply of propane throughout the year. If you have questions or would like to discuss a budget plan tailored to your needs, please don't hesitate to reach out.

Agronomy and Crop Inputs

For those needing input loans, please contact your local banker. All spring agronomy bills are due by June 10 to receive a 5% discount. Subsequent payments are due on the 10th of each month to maintain this discount. If you miss these deadlines, you will lose the discount and incur

an 18% interest rate. However, we do accept the JD Farm Plan, which offers a more favorable interest rate of 10.9%. Communication is key, so please call me before any issues arise, and I'll work with you to find a solution.

Gas Station Charging Accounts

For those with charging accounts at our gas station, remember that each account has a credit limit. Once this limit is reached, you won't be able to charge further until your account is paid in full. Our terms are net 30 days, and we allow charging for short-term convenience. Unlike major credit cards, we require payment in full each month. If you're purchasing tires and encounter credit issues, please contact me to discuss your options.

Credit Policy and Appreciation

In today's economy, budgets are tighter than ever. I want to emphasize that credit is a privilege, and I'm committed to protecting both Hutchinson Co-op's assets and your interests. 


Figure 3. Tar spot sto

The Best Weeds to Control Are Ones That Never Emerge

As spring planting season approaches, one of the biggest challenges for growers is dealing with weeds. Weeds compete with your crops for vital resources like water, sunlight, and nutrients. If left unchecked, they can significantly reduce your yield.

Why Early Weed Control Matters

Weeds can grow surprisingly fast. For example:

- Waterhemp can grow up to an inch per day in the right conditions.
- Giant ragweed can grow at twice the rate of many other annual weeds.

To effectively manage these weeds, it's essential to tackle them when they are small—ideally around 2-5 inches tall, which is about the size of a soda can. When these plants are small, they have less growing points making it easier to control them.

The Role of Preemergence Herbicides

One effective strategy is to use preemergence herbicides right after planting or impregnated into your fertilizer. These herbicides work by preventing weed seeds from germinating and emerging. Here are some key benefits:

- Clean Start: They help create a clean field for your crops.
- 2. Less Competition: With fewer weeds, your crops can establish themselves better.
- 3. Yield Protection: Reducing weed pressure lowers the risk of yield loss.

4. Extended Control: Preemergence herbicides typically provide 14-21 days of protection, especially with some rainfall to help incorporate them into the soil.

Creating a Solid Weed Control Plan

To maximize your weed control efforts:

- Follow Up with Post-Emergence Herbicides: Aim to apply these within the protection window provided by your preemergence treatment.
- Include Residual Herbicides: Adding a residual herbicide to your post-emergence mix can help keep weeds at bay until your crops fully canopy.
- 3. Plan for Overlap: Having a strategy that overlaps your residual herbicides will better protect your investment and set you up for a good foundation of weed control for this growing season and the next.

By focusing on preventing weeds from emerging and controlling them when they're small, you can protect your crops and improve your chances for a successful harvest. Remember, the best weeds to control are those that never get the chance to grow!

Propane Update

As we wrap up the 2024-2025 heating season, here are some important reminders and updates for our valued propane customers:

Contract Gallons and Tank Top-Offs

If you have remaining contract gallons, make sure to top off your propane tanks by April 25th, 2025. This ensures you utilize your contracted price before the season ends.

Routine Leak Tests

This spring and summer, we'll be conducting routine leak tests as required by law. These tests are crucial for ensuring the safety and integrity of your propane system. We'll reach out to you if we have any concerns or need to schedule a test. Leak tests are required whenever there's an interruption in service, including when tanks run empty.

Delivery Options: Will Call vs. Regular Schedule Delivery (RSD)

It's important to understand the difference between our delivery options:

- Will Call: You're responsible for monitoring your tank levels. Call when your tank reaches 25-30% capacity. Be aware of potential fees:
- Out of Gas fee: \$75 to \$175
- Same-day delivery fee: \$50 to \$100 during business hours, \$175 after hours
- 2. Regular Schedule Delivery (RSD): We share the responsibility of monitoring your tank. Benefits include:
- No same-day delivery fees
- Reduced out of gas fee (\$50) if your account is in good standing

• Requires a charge account or budget plan

RSD is generally a better program as it reduces the risk of running out of gas and minimizes unexpected fees.

Tank Monitoring System

Consider our tank monitoring system for more precise tracking:

- Will Call customers: \$51/year rental fee
- RSD customers: Rental fee waived
- Provides daily updates on tank levels
- Requires an email address for Will Call customers (optional for RSD)

For more information about our monitoring system or to discuss switching to RSD, please call me directly at 320-234-0418.

Remember, propane safety is our top priority. Always check your tank's expiration date, typically found on the collar or handle. If your tank is expired, we can help you with recertification or replacement options.




